Know who you are Spiritually

3 Observations

- 1) Without new birth there is no life and no relationship with God
 - a. **John 14:6** Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.
- 2) In new birth, new perspective comes as we see the kingdom of God. God's word becomes clear, and the Holy Spirit's works and wonders are believed and experienced faith comes alive.
 - a. **John 3:3** Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again."
- 3) Through new birth we are introduced- literally we "enter" to a new realm, where God's new kingdom order can be realized.
 - a. **John 3:5** Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit.

New birth is more than simply being saved. It is requalifying experience, opening up the possibilities of our whole being to the supernatural dimension of life and fitting us for a beginning in Gods Kingdom order

Know who you are Biblically

Foundation: If you do not know your history... you do not know your destiny

Reminder: all Believer acknowledge and come into understanding that the Word of God is infallible (Flawless)

Location, Location - People of Color

Acts 17:26

26 From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands.

One man - Adam (pre-flood)/Noah (after-flood)

God formed Adam from the dust of the ground – Genesis 2:7

Genesis 2:7

7 Then the Lord God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being.

• After the flood: Noah and his sons (Genesis 9:18-19 and 10:1-32)

Noah had three sons named Ham, Shem and Japheth. (resulted in 70 nations)

Know Who We Are Culturally

Note: Christianity was not established for simply one nation, but Christ dies for the salvation of all nations

Psalm 68:31

31 Envoys will come from Egypt; Cush will submit herself to God.

Made Alive In Christ

From God's Perspective (the only perspective that counts)

1 Samuel 16:7

But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The LORD does not look at the things people look at.

People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

Let's not get sidetracked with genealogy/skin color

We will close this teaching with 3 more Observations

God did not see skin color, but in Ephesians chapter 2 we get a glimpse of what He did see.

Ephesians 2:1-10

Observation #1: Our Initial Position

Observation #3: A Re-Positioned Nation

6 And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, 7 in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. 8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast. 10 For we are God's handiwork, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

- God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus
- That he might show the incomparable riches of his grace
- by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God
- we are God's handiwork
- created in Christ Jesus to do good works
- God prepared these good works in advance for us to do (He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation Mark 16:15).

• Titus 3:4-7 4 But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, 5 he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, 6 whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, 7 so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life.

- 2 Tim 1:9 He has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything
 we have done but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given
 us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time,
- 1 Cor 1:29 so that no one may boast before him.

¹⁰ For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

- **Eph 4:22-24** 22 You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; 23 to be made new in the attitude of your minds; 24 *and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.*
- Titus 2:14 who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good.
